

## Year 7 Catch – Up Premium

The Catch - Up Literacy and Numeracy premium provides schools with an additional £500 for each Year 7 pupil who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and / or maths at the end of key stage 2.

### 2015-2016

23 students eligible for funding totalling £11,500.

Students eligible for Catch-Up premium benefitted from :

- Small group work in both Literacy and Numeracy (in addition to their normal lessons) provided by subject specialists
- Additional resources to support specific interventions
- Turn around maths and or reading ( daily intensive support )

### Impact of the funding :

Numeracy : 87% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

Literacy : 88% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

### 2014-2015

44 students eligible for funding totalling £22,000.

The impact of intervention, with a high % of students making expected progress or above in both numeracy and literacy led to further intervention strategies being implemented for the 2014-2015 academic year.

Students eligible for Catch-Up premium benefitted from :

- Small group work (in addition to their normal numeracy and literacy lessons) for the whole Autumn term and beyond were necessary
- New resources to support specific numeracy interventions
- Lexia groups to provide additional literacy AND numeracy
- TA's and HLTA's to be provided with CPD in numeracy strategies
- Turn around maths and or reading ( daily intensive support )

### Impact of the funding :

Numeracy : 87% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

Literacy : 86% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

### 2013-2014

43 students eligible for funding totalling £21,500.

Funds were used to provide :

- Intensive small group work for new cohort 2 x 50 minute sessions per week in both literacy and/ or numeracy
- Further implementation of new assessment materials
- One-to-one tuition for identified students

In addition to existing interventions already in place :

- Step-up groups in literacy
- TA support in lessons in both literacy and numeracy
- ASDAN groups
- Lexia groups run by TA's and HLTA's providing extra literacy support
- Turn-around maths
- Turn around reading

### Impact of the funding :

Numeracy : 70% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

Literacy : 76% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

## 2012-2013

At Bungay High school 52 students were eligible for Catch-Up Premium funds totalling £26,000.

Funds were used :

- To purchase assessment materials for both numeracy and literacy
- To pay for additional teacher time in both literacy and numeracy to provide intensive small group work.
- To purchase additional resources to support small group work.

This was in addition to existing interventions already in place :

- Step-up groups in literacy
- TA support in lessons in both literacy and numeracy
- ASDAN groups
- Lexia groups run by TA's and HLTA's providing extra literacy support

## Impact of the funding

Numeracy : 69% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

Literacy : 66% of students eligible for funding made expected progress or above

Students reacted very positively to the additional support which was then continued into Year 8.
